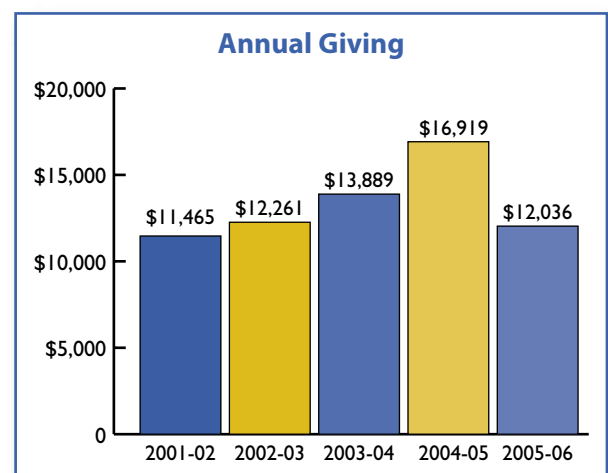

### *Jim Snook '59 Back in the Fold with Phi Delt After Receiving His First Issue of The Buckeye Phi in Over 40 Years*

As an undergraduate, **Jim Snook '59** valued his Phi Delt experience, and went through a period of personal growth. After graduation, Jim gradually lost touch with Ohio Zeta, which unfortunately many of our brothers do.

Recently, Jim received an issue of *The Buckeye Phi* – the first edition he's seen in more than 40 years! It turns out our alumni

relations office had found him through a lost-member search of our database, in an attempt to find the current whereabouts of brothers who have become lost over the years. When he contacted us to express his delight, we helped to put him in touch with other brothers from his era of the fraternity he so fondly remembers.

#### ***Why did you join the fraternity?***

I liked the guys, the upper classmen. The house was incomplete, it was going through a renovation that looked to be on hold. So it wasn't the house that drew me to Phi Delta Theta, it was the brothers.

#### ***What was your favorite memory of the fraternity?***

My time at Phi Delta Theta was probably the period of greatest personal growth for me as a young person. To me, Phi Delta Theta was the beginning of a personal journey as a life-long learner.

#### ***What kind of influence has this had on your life?***

The fraternity was a microcosm of people interacting like they do out in the world, and that was just fascinating to me. I went to college hoping to find out why people do what they do. Partially because I had a serious problem with my father; I needed to know why we are the way we are, so that I could improve my relationship with him. I found out much more than I hoped, and what I learned affected my whole life. It empowered me to realize and understand that life could be an ongoing learning experience, and that I could turn most situations into "win-wins." This was an exciting and productive revelation that has been beneficial throughout my whole life.

#### ***What activities were you involved in during college?***

I was secretary of the fraternity as a sophomore, and one of my jobs was to do an alumni newsletter. Nobody else wanted to do it; it was not of much interest to typical college students. I did the newsletter partially because I wanted to keep a good tradition going, and because I was looking forward to receiving them as an alumnus. Then I was chapter president when I was an upperclassman.

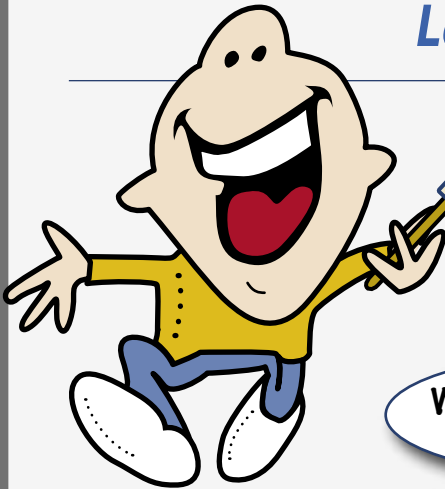
