




As philanthropy chairman, I am responsible for setting up and coordinating all events within our chapter. I balance it with my school work and my job by doing as much as I can do on days where I am

#### For Chris Peele '90, a Blind Date Set Up by Fraternity Brother Led to His Current Seven-Member Family

Life's little lessons. We all see them and accept them in different ways. Chris Peele's '90 circumstances are no different from our own. He is a man who actively makes choices to benefit himself and his family.

Ohio State holds a special place in Chris' heart. Not only did he join a fraternity that would influence his life, but he was also pressured into a date set up by Mike Tzagournis '92, through which Chris met the woman that he would eventually marry. He and his wife Lisa have five children and even live in the same neighborhood has Mike. Chris loves to tell his children about "Mr. Mike" and how he made it possible for them to be a family.

When Chris decided to attend Ohio State, he actively chose to immerse himself in a fraternity and to become part of an intimate community at a large university. He wanted the opportunity to find his own niche and form a lasting network that would exist throughout his life. Chris found his niche at Phi Delta Theta. He admired the outstanding individuals that were members of Phi Delta Theta and felt that their leadership abilities were far above most of the men that he knew. Chris trusted his instincts. when they arrived, the jobs fell through and they were forced to rely on each other and the skills that they had learned at the fraternity. They worked together as a group, being resourceful and flexible – always there to help each other out. Finding jobs at restaurants, painting houses, and roofing in the California desert, they all survived and had a great time. Chris even introduced Chad to a girl that he met on the beach. And as it happens in Chris' circle, Chad eventually married her and they currently reside in Phoenix with their three children.

Driving back to Ohio State, Chris found that summer to be completely worth it. Even as he pulled onto campus completely broke, spending the last dollar in his pocket on a hamburger at Wendy's, he would recommend the experience to anyone.

Phi Delta Theta definitely influenced Chris' life. He believes that no other organization at the University could provide such a large number of opportunities in a collegiate atmosphere. Instead of viewing Bridget's birth as a tragedy, they actively chose to accept the challenges that their family would face and embrace each day accepting each of their children for their own accomplishments. Lisa has established a website, **www.bridgets-light.com**, to share the Peele family's experiences with Bridget. Their goals are to provide hope and inspiration for others and to influence the medical community as they work with parents whose children have been diagnosed with Down Syndrome. It is truly an inspirational website and a snapshot into the lives of Chris, Lisa, and their family.

Chris remarks that all of us deal with challenges. "Some people ignore them, some people are crippled by them, and some people learn and grow through them. It's a choice." Chris has chosen to enjoy every day with his family, watching all of them grow, being happy, and overcoming their own personal challenges.
