REMEMBERING RICHARD MAXWELL '64

OSU Graduate Spent Life Helping Disabled People

A man paralyzed during a fraternity football game who went on to pioneer accessibility

We have also recently learned of the deaths of the following brothers:

George Sargent '37 Norman Zollar '38 M. Feigert '42 Roland Miltz '42 Gordon Lanum '50 John Russell '67 for disabled students at Ohio State University died April 28, 2011.

Richard "Max" Maxwell '64 scored the winning touchdown at an OSU intramural game in November 1963, said Ken Johnson, a fraternity brother at Phi Delta Theta and a longtime friend. As he dove into the end zone, the ball slipped and ended up under his neck, helping to break it.

"There wasn't any place for a 21-year-old quadriplegic in those days," said his wife, Kathryn Maxwell.

"Max," as almost everyone knew him, spent the rest of his life changing that. He died peacefully, after a short illness, at 69 years old, his wife said.

In 1974, he helped to found Creative

Living, a nonprofit organization that provides apartments for disabled students near the OSU campus. He also became an administrator in the school's disability-services office and pushed for wheelchair ramps and other changes on campus to make it easier for disabled students to attend classes.

"He was a wonderful man," said Lois Harris, the director of disability-services office, who worked with Maxwell for years. "He helped not only himself but so many other people."

Ohio Zeta Phi Mikey Hirsch had been bedridden at a hospital in Cleveland because of a severe case of pancreatitis that spread throughout his body resulting in the removal and complications of some of his organs. Mikey was in the hospital for several months undergoing multiple surgeries.

On Saturday, May 14, over 150 people came out to a local Columbus bowling center to show their support and donate to

the cause. Philanthropy Chairman **Michael Haddock** said the event brought in a total of \$1,500, which is the most successful philanthropic event for Ohio Zeta in the past three years. The money benefited Mikey and his family in this time of need.

For the men of Ohio Zeta, planning this event was just another part of exemplifying the principles of friendship and brotherhood. "In the words of Founding Father Robert Morrison, 'To do what ought to be done but would not have been done
