Brother Nicholas J. Rozanski Killed In Duty

Our deepest condolences to the Rozanski family on the loss of Captain Nicholas J. Rozanski, 36.
Rozanski was one of three U.S. soldiers killed in a suicide attack in Afghanistan on April 4. Rozanski, a Columbus, OH resident, leaves behind his wife and two young daughters.

"I want him to be remembered as a hero and that he was a great leader in the National Guard and he cared about his soldiers," Rozanski's wife said in an Associated Press interview. "He was a great father to our children and he loved every minute with them." (www.rozanskimemorial.com)
